ON Friday, Angeline Baker and I had the privilege of attending a luncheon at Lambeth Palace to celebrate the science and faith projects which have been given grants from the Templeton fund. It was a privilege to be there, not only to hear about exciting projects taking place elsewhere – from Northumberland to the south coast – but also to be able to make a brief presentation, using slides brilliantly prepared by Richard Ashley, about our 'Water in Life' project. The whole event was an important reminder that the Christian faith was historically at the forefront of scientific endeavour and discovery, and that God cares about the world he redeems, judges and creates in Jesus Christ.

On my way to Lambeth, I walked past Channel Four's buildings in Westminster. This week, Channel Four News conducted an investigation into the allegedly abusive behaviour of a past leader of the Christian camps for public schoolboys held at Iwerne Minster in Dorset. The Iwerne camps have been an important part of the life of the Church of England for very many years. Many, humanly speaking, owe their salvation to the gospel they first heard there. Most of the significant Evangelical leaders of the Church of England in the twentieth century attended Iwerne. It is therefore especially tragic that one man may have abused the trust placed in him in the 1970s and early 1980s.

This very sad case is a reminder to us all to do everything we can to make sure our churches are safe places, especially for children and young people. Checks are made with the Disclosure and Barring Service for those who work with children, for example in our Sunday Club. Jane Wardman is our safeguarding officer. Safeguarding really matters, because children and young people really matter, and we long for them to hear the good news about Jesus and to put their trust in him.
